Who is eligible?

Those who live in bush fire prone land, and who are infirm, disabled, or elderly.

AIDER services may include:

to infirm, disabled and elderly residents who live in bush fire prone land, to better prepare

- > thinning vegetation
- removing leaves, sticks and fallen branches
- > trimming branches from around and overhanging the home
- > mowing or slashing long grass
- > cleaning gutters.

An assessment of your property will be completed by NSW RFS staff. Assistance can be provided to complete a Bush Fire Survival Plan. All works are completed by NSW RFS Mitigation crews.
