ASSISTANCE FOR INFIRM, DISABLED AND ELDERLY RESIDENTS

What is AIDER?

AIDER is a one-off free service provided to infirm, disabled and elderly residents who live in bush fire prone land, to better prepare their properties for bush fire, in conjunction with the development of a bush fire survival plan.

Who is eligible?

Those who live in bush fire prone land, and who are infirm, disabled, or elderly.

AIDER services may include:

- thinning vegetation
- removing leaves, sticks and fallen branches
- trimming branches from around and overhanging the home
- mowing or slashing long grass
- cleaning gutters.

An assessment of your property will be completed by NSW RFS staff. Assistance can be provided to complete a Bush Fire Survival Plan. All works are completed by NSW RFS Mitigation crews.
